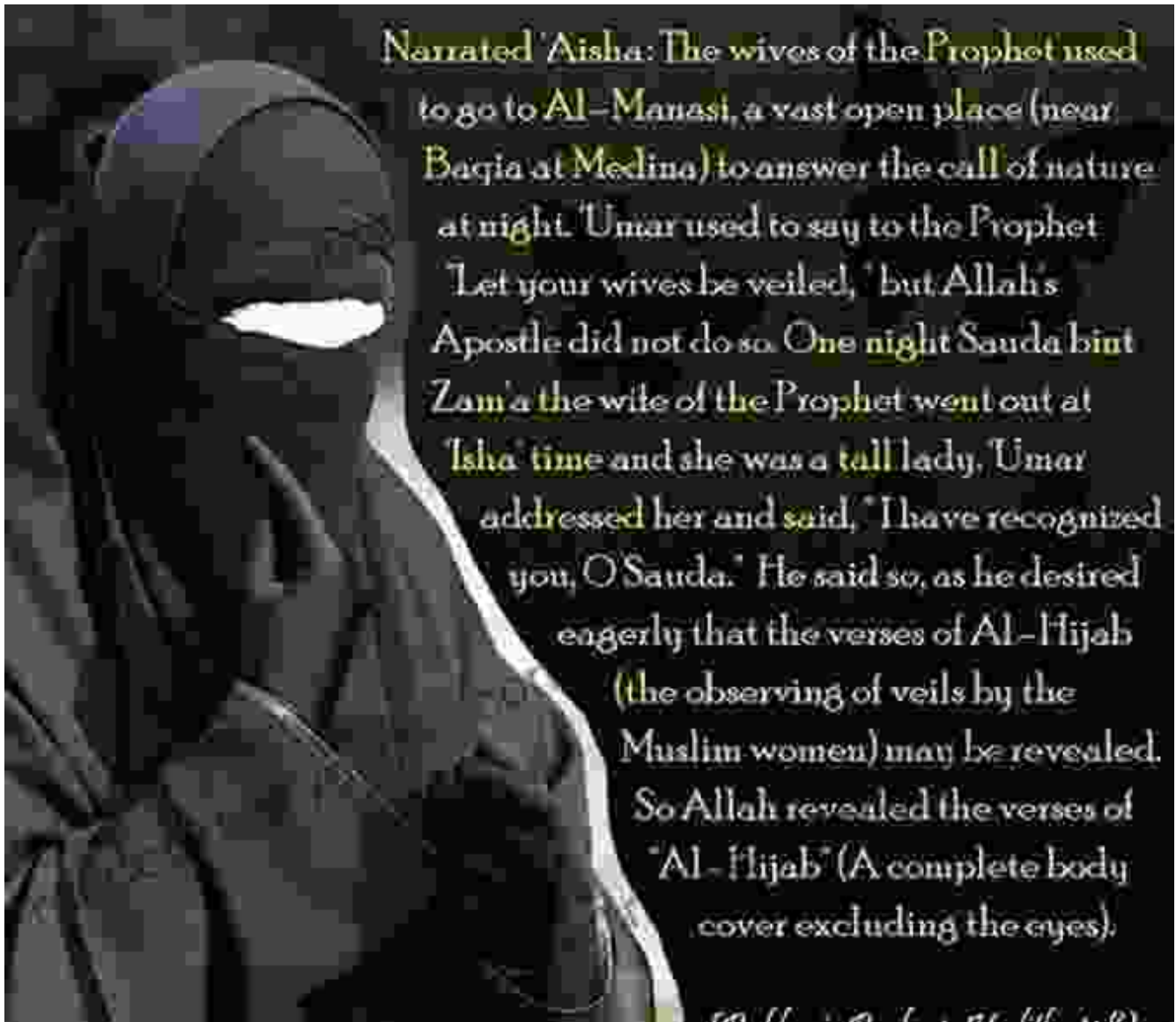
O ye, the Prophet (ﷺ), convey to your wives and your daughters and the women of the believers (that they ought to) hang their cloaks over themselves (in its entirety). This is more suitable that they will be recognized (from their attire alone without having them to be barefaced) and not be harassed. And as is Allah Oft-Forgiving, Most Merciful.

### Quranic Verse 33:59 on Hijab

This verse encourages Muslim women to "draw their cloaks close around them" when venturing outside their homes. The purpose of this practice is to conceal their physical attributes from strangers and maintain a dignified and modest demeanor in public.

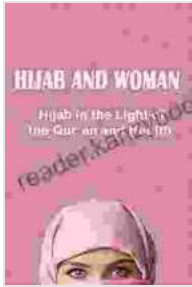

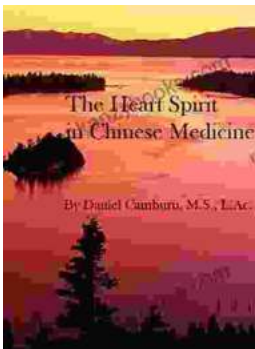
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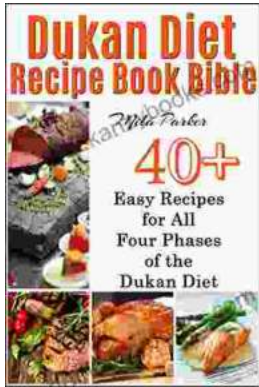
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
